

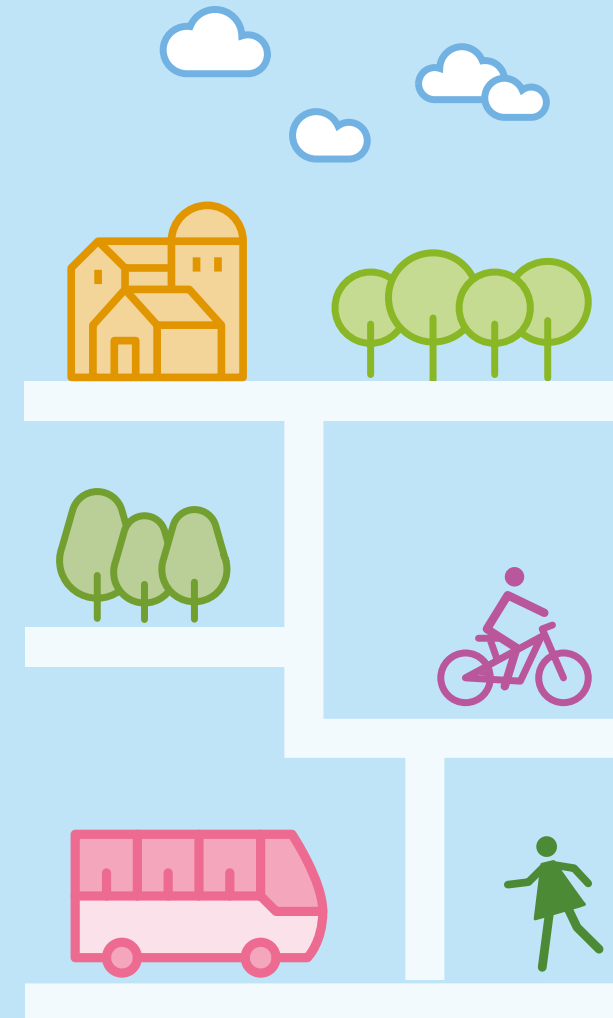

The Kusel district is home to 70,000 people in 98 villages covering an area of 122 km². The largest village has 6,000 inhabitants, and the smallest has 140.

It is a structurally weak region with a high proportion of elderly people. However, it has almost the most cars per capita in all of Germany.



The district has three administrative areas, each with its own Bürgerbus-project.

- 35 - 45 volunteers are drivers, “copilot” or sitting on the phone.
- The door-to-door-service is free of charge.
- The journeys must be booked in advance.

The Bürgerbus is running two days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

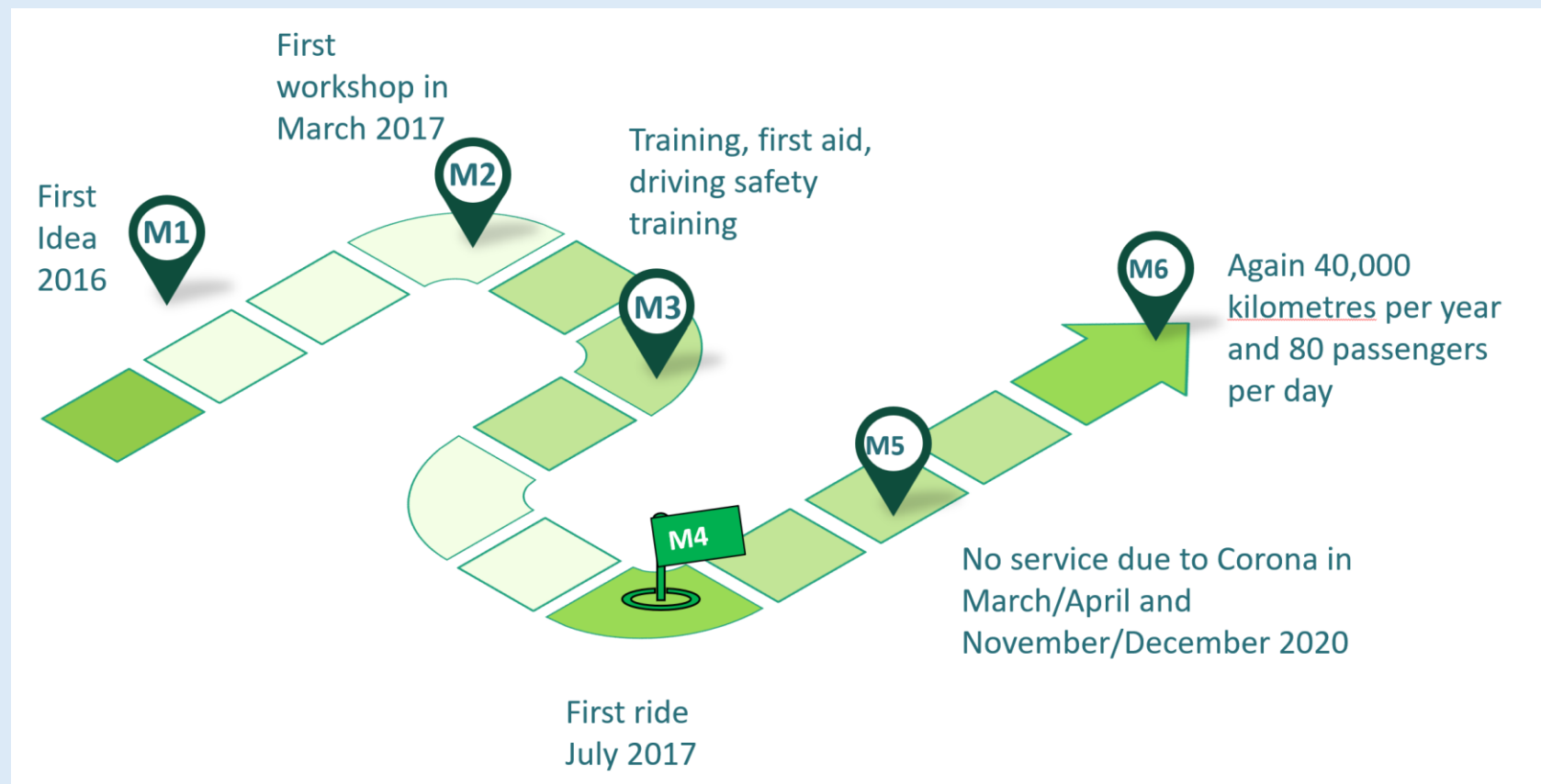
- The service operates on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- The phone is available on two afternoons from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM.
- Two buses travel through 23 villages, carrying approximately 40 - 80 passengers per day.

The Bürgerbus in the Oberes Glantal municipality has been running for eight years now.

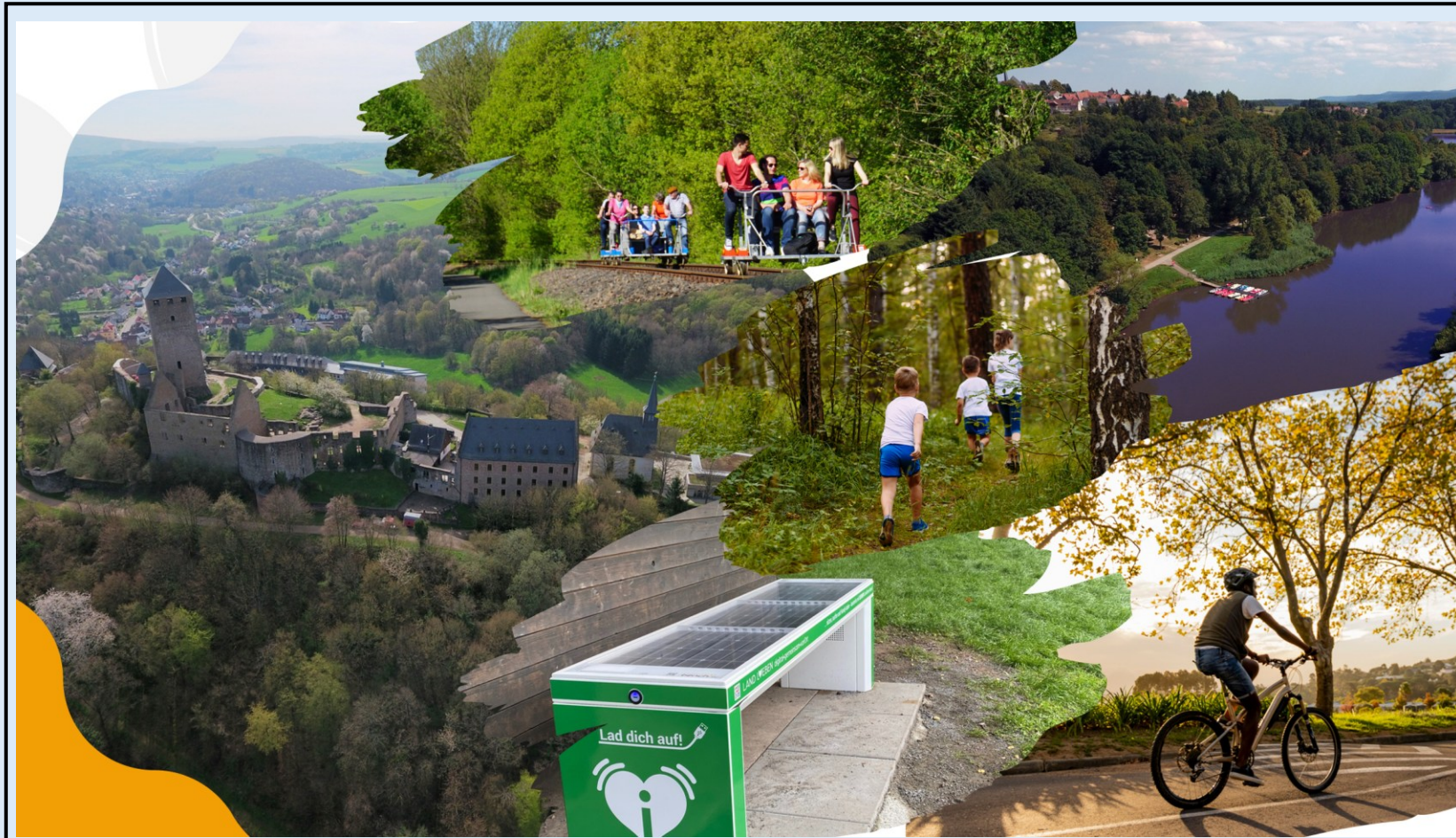
The municipality covers the costs and receives support from local financial institutions.
